Shorewood SEED Foundation Committees

- a. **Executive Committee.** Make interim decision on behalf of the full board as needed. Recommend strategy and direction for SEED. Evaluate effectiveness of SEED structure and activities and recommend changes as needed to SEED board. Ensure regular communication between SEED members, SEED committees and SEED board. (Limited to SEED officers.) Responsible in part for SEED goal 5: Build a sustainable organization.
- b. **Fund Development Committee**. Develop strategy for fundraising to increase financial resources, including gifts of cash, annuities, bequests, and other methods. Recommend whether and how to seek unrestricted gifts as well as gifts to support specific educational goals in Shorewood. Recommend share of funds distributed for short-term ends versus long-term goals including endowments. Acknowledge all gifts to SEED. Recognize donors at events, on programs, etc. Responsible for SEED Goal 1: Raise Funds.
- c. **Awards Committee**. Implement and oversee SEED awards policy. Responsible for SEED Goal 2: Distribute Funds.
- d. **Special Events Committee**. Recommend strategy and calendar for special events to SEED board, including community-wide event(s) and donor-development event(s). Coordinate development of strategy with other SEED committees, particularly Fund Development. Oversee special events.
- e. Community Relations Committee. Create and sustain cooperative relationships with other groups in the Shorewood community, especially those involved in supporting education. Seek ways to work with these groups on joint activities that increase overall support for education in Shorewood. Recruit volunteers and liaisons for SEED. Responsible for SEED Goal 3: Maintain and build bridges between SEED and other Shorewood organizations.
- f. Marketing and Communications Committee. Increase the general visibility of SEED in the wider community and publicize SEED events and activities. Oversee SEED identity, including graphic and content standards for all SEED communications (print, electronic, mail, stationery, brochures, etc.) Maintain content on SEED WEB site. Maintain master SEED activity calendar and ensure that event schedules are coordinated. Support the publicity needs of other SEED committees.
- g. **Financial Oversight Committee**. Develop infrastructure to accept multiple giving methods (checks, credit card, direct debit.) Recommend and oversee disbursement policy. Recommend and oversee investment policy. Ensure that SEED financial activities are sound, prudent, and meet all applicable legal standards. Responsible in part for SEED goal 5: Build a sustainable organization.
- h. **Nominating Committee.** Develop criteria and process for nomination to the board, accept names for consideration, contact and recruit potential board members, explain to them role of board member, identify timeline for elections.

The Directors of the Shorewood SEED Foundation are expected to play an active role in the organization. In agreeing to serve on the Board, member are committing to:

- Supporting the mission and objectives of the Foundation
- Participating regularly in monthly board meetings
- Serving on one or more SEED committees

- Providing financial support to the best of their ability
- Participating in raising funds for the organization
